Gilmerton Neurological Care Centre is located in Edinburgh South in the Moredun area. We are close to shops, amenities, public transport and the A772. Cameron Toll Shopping Centre is just one mile away.

Transport

The service has good transport links. Edinburgh airport is 13 miles away on the City of Edinburgh Bypass. Waverley train station is 3.3 miles away. There is a good network of Lothian buses. The centre has access to the Care Home minibus and this is used for excursions. The centre has contract taxis to support service users on medical appointments.

Types of care provided

We provide slow stream rehabilitation for residents with acquired brain injuries and those with palliative care needs. Some individuals may still have the potential to make continuous progress even several years after the brain injury although this may be slow. This helps to maintain and regain some functionality.

Rehabilitation:

Covering brain injury rehabilitation and a range of neurological conditions such as: Motor Neurone Disease, Multiple Sclerosis (M.S.), Parkinson's Disease, Epilepsy, Stroke, and other neurological conditions.

Nursing:

GNCC provides 24-hour nursing care delivered by a team of nurses and carers, led by our Clinical Nurse Lead Coordinator.

Palliative:

GNCC has achieved 7 Steps to ACP for Care Home Staff (Anticipatory Care Planning - a long-term programme in partnership with Edinburgh Health and Social Care) and also receive support from Marie Curie, for service users who require end-of-life care.

Physio/Occupational/Functional Therapy Team:

This team provides comprehensive interdisciplinary assessment and intervention for various neurological conditions.

Goals and interventions include improvement of cognitive skills, development of compensatory skills for permanent neurocognitive deficits, development of psychological coping skills to improve emotional wellbeing, activities of daily living, leisure and recreational activities, and return to assisted work where possible.

The team provides support in the following areas:

The centre is situated on the ground floor with access to the garden.








lounges

Approved provider scheme

Gilmerton NCC is incredibly proud to be named one of Headway's Approved Providers. Headway – The Brain Injury Association, are a UK-wide charity that works to improve life after brain injury by providing vital support and information services.

In order to be recognised as a Headway Approved Provider for acquired brain injuries, we have to demonstrate that we can provide appropriate specialist care for those with complex, physical and or cognitive impairment due to acquired brain injury. Accreditation involves meeting specific standards and ensuring team support families and the needs of service users. Our current accreditation period runs from 2020 – 2022.

Key aspects of the process include ensuring our team are aware of and responsive to issues associated with ABI, and that we give total consideration to the information and other needs of the service user, their family and carers.





GP/Medical Cover

Gilmerton NCC work with a comprehensive multidisciplinary team through our GP referrals for our service users, providing access to clinical experts in specialist areas: SALT, Dietician, Counselling, Psychiatrist, Psychologist, Neurological Consultants etc.

Physiotherapist will referrer to Occupational Therapist (O.T.), Sitting Assessment Clinging, Spasticity Clinic and other specialist departments when required.

Service users benefit from regular reviews by specialist consultants in areas such as MS, Epilepsy, Behaviour Management, Parkinsons etc.
